# LOOKING BACK, BUILDING FORWARD

The three decades since we celebrated the opening of JCC Budapest-Bálint Ház have come and gone in the blink of an eye. We are excited to mark this milestone with you and to share highlights from the past year on the following pages.

Back in the early 1990s, it was difficult to imagine a vibrant future for Hungarian Jewry after the Holocaust and a long era of Communist rule, but we were very lucky to have dear friends who shared our dreams of Jewish revival and helped us lay our foundation.

Foremost among them was the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee (JDC), our American partner, which established and supported us for our first twenty-five years. The Balint Family from England invested in us, too, taking us from concept to construction while giving our building its Hungarian name – Bálint Ház, or Balint House. Today, we are proud to operate independently as the Bálint Jewish Community House Foundation.

October 2023-September 2024 was a big year for us. Not only did we kick off a season of 30th birthday celebrations with exciting developments in each of our key program areas, but more community members than ever filled our halls with their enthusiasm for Jewish life. And it is they, our Jewish family, who make JCC Budapest-Bálint Ház feel like home.

Budapest Mayor Gergely Karácsony, our festival patron, welcomed over 200 guests and dignitaries to our opening night celebration, among them Israeli Ambassador Yacov Hadas-Handelsman and German Ambassador Julia Gross. In his remarks, US Ambassador David Pressman stressed the importance of events like ZSIFI in combatting antisemitism and preserving diversity.

### ZS JEWISH AND ISRAELI FILM FESTIVAL

ZSIFI, the largest Jewish film festival in Central and Eastern Europe, has become a Budapest cultural institution.

Each November, we feature the best in contemporary Israeli and Jewish-themed films that reflect the diversity of the Jewish experience on screen, striking the perfect balance between entertainment and insight.

The tragic events of October 7 and the ensuing war transformed our 12th annual ZSIFI festival from a cultural event into a public opportunity for members of the Jewish community to work through our trauma together. Hostage posters were

prominently displayed in theaters and the crisis was a key topic at post-screening panel discussions.

Though we selected the slate of films weeks before the attack, two choices seemed prescient in retrospect. The Child by Yahav Wiener, who was murdered during the massacre at Kfar Aza, was a featured short film. And Golda, a biopic about Prime Minister Golda Meir during the Yom Kippur War, proved an especially poignant choice for opening night.

# JEWISH KNWWLEDGE & LEARNING

JCC Budapest brings its unique brand of universal Judaism to the community, breathing fresh air into ancient traditions. Through holiday celebrations, educational programs, youth camps, and social opportunities, people of all ages, interests, and backgrounds find their own path to Jewish connection.

On Pesach, over **100** community members gathered for a Seder + game night, a fun and festive modern twist on a millennia-old ceremony.



HXLIDAY PROGRAMS

#### **DIY THE** HOLIDAYS

For those who live far from the JCC or are just looking to bring that special JCC holiday energy into their own homes, our popular DIY holiday kits were the perfect resource. We quickly sold out of all 75 boxes filled with holiday musthaves, from ritual objects to recipes. Our eight interactive holiday websites were curated with everything needed to celebrate at home.

Our holiday schedule was packed this past year with innovative programs that attracted new audiences, enlarging the JCC Budapest family.



### LIGHT UP THE NIGHT

Over 250 people joined our annual Family Chanukah Party at the JCC, a fantastic evening of music, dance, games, latkes, and sufganiyot. We took enormous pride in having so many community members celebrate the holiday with us.



### **TU B'SHVAT TOGETHER**

In cooperation with several local partners, we organized a fun-filled activity fair and traditional Tu B'shvat seder at the Rumbach Synagogue. It was one of our best-loved events of the year, attended by more than 200 children and their parents.

### **JCC BUDAPEST HOLIDAY AMBASSADORS**

Our 38 holiday ambassadors played a central role in raising the profile of our DIY Judaism initiative. After hosting holiday celebrations for family and friends at home using JCC resources, they promoted their experiences and our holiday boxes and cards on their social media platforms to encourage others to follow suit.

### PICK A CARD, ANY CARD

Our Shabbat and Passover Seder game decks are now available in four languages, with Russian added this year. The English-language cards ship anywhere via Amazon.



### F@RYOUNG AUDIENCES

JCC Budapest's commitment to the younger generation reflects our faith in the future of Hungarian Jewry. We offer joyful programs that inspire a love of Judaism and a strong sense of Jewish pride. These programs also offer a space for building lasting friendships, disconnecting from social media, and developing leadership skills.



### **JCAMPING IN THE COUNTRY**

Back for its fifth incredible season, this past year's JCamp took place in late March at the JDC-Lauder Szarvas Camp, just a two hourdrive from the city. We once again designed an unforgettable, overnight Jewish camping experience for more than 100 campers and madrichim who had the time of their lives. We continued to leverage that enthusiasm by engaging campers and their families in year-round JCC programming. For the madrichim, we also provided a continuum of leadership development.

### **CAMP JICHAK FAMILY CAMP**

Our annual family camp pulsed with the wonderful energy of 300 campers – more than 100 children and their parents – as summer came to an end. Hosted by JCC Budapest and the Manora Association at

the JDC-Lauder Szarvas Camp, this immersive experience had the children singing and dancing, playing and making art, all while exploring Jewish traditions, like a beautiful Kabbalat Shabbat.



#### **BUILDING BRIDGES**

In partnership with the Jewish Federation of San Diego, we hosted the Global Ambassadors Program (GAP), bringing together 12 Hungarian and 12 American teens for a weeklong cultural exchange in Budapest. The two groups bonded while enjoying cultural and tourist activities as well as a community Shabbat and a Jewish identity workshop. Participants are already asking what comes next, looking to keep the connection going.

### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

### **BACK TO OUR ROOTS**

Our experiential programs encourage community members to delve into the many layers of their Jewish heritage. With something for everyone, we are a hub of activity all week long.

### GLOBAL DAY OF JEWISH LEARNING

Once again, JCC Budapest participated in this meaningful intercontinental event. Taking our own unique approach, we offered several program tracks that included formal study, a cooking workshop, art therapy, and so much more. Over 100 community members joined in, including many new faces that had never attended our events before.

### A NIGHT WITH THE JCC



Our Shavuot celebration has become so popular, we moved it from the JCC to a more spacious venue this year. The switch allowed us to host 280 participants for multiple parallel sessions, among them prayer gatherings, formal study, crafting, debates about the pros and cons of keeping kosher, and a panel on women in Jewish communal leadership roles.



### THE POWER OF MEMORY

We partnered with the Here and Now Company Art Foundation to give a group of Jewish and non-Jewish students the chance to explore Budapest's wartime memories through a contemporary lens. Seventeen high schoolers and five Holocaust survivors explored together the timely question, Where do you feel safe today? The experience culminated on January 27, International Holocaust Remembrance Day, with a student-led theatrical installation staged in the Jewish Quarter.

### **SHALOM CLUB**

Our 200-strong senior and survivor club was, as always, the most active at the JCC, meeting almost every day, often on Zoom. Their diverse activities ranged from Mah Jong to Hebrew classes, Zumba to holiday celebrations, keeping this inspirational group young in mind and body.



### **CULTURE CLUBS @THE JCC**

The amateur Community Choir performed classic and contemporary Jewish and Israeli music at events throughout the year. For those who like traditional – and not so

traditional – Israeli folk dancing, Hora Dance House was the place to be on Monday evenings. And of course, we continued our very popular board game nights.

### SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

At JCC Budapest-Bálint Ház, we embrace diversity and are passionate about the Jewish values of kindness and mutual support. Even when resources are limited, we remain steadfast in our commitment to assist those in need, partnering with organizations and activists who share our dream of making the world a better place.



### **MITZVAH PROJECT**

This recurring JCC program creates opportunities for young community members to experience the privilege and joy of giving back. This year, we engaged eight Jewish high school students in hands-on volunteer work with NGOs addressing food insecurity in Budapest. The multiweek project culminated on our annual JCC Mitzvah Day. Over 70 participants came to hear the students talk about their work and to witness the unveiling of our new Mitzvah Wall honoring the JCC's community partners.

### PRIDE AND LGBTQ+ KABBALAT SHABBAT

As anti-minority agitation intensified in Hungary, we reinforced our commitment to allyship and inclusion. In addition to our regular LGBTQ+ inclusive worship events and Pride March representation, we hosted panel discussions featuring spiritual leaders of different faiths to explore the relationship between religious and LGBTQ+ identities. It was an important step towards our goal of creating a Minorities for Minorities network.







### LIFE-CHANGING **SUPPORT FOR ROMA WOMEN**

Roma refugees from Transcarpathia who live in squalid conditions in the Hungarian countryside face discrimination and receive limited aid. The women are especially vulnerable, with no resources to purchase feminine hygiene products and little or no access to reproductive health care. In response, the JCC distributed more than 100 packages filled with items critical for their gynecological and sexual health along with general toiletries for their children and families.

### **ALL-HEARTS CLUB**

On Mondays, we host a special program for a group with Down syndrome, and special education needs, who visit JCC Budapest for developmental activities that engage them in stories and play.

Inclusion is an essential component of all the work we do. To that end, we offer multiple programs for children and adults with a range of special needs and disabilities, enhancing their lives while also enriching the experience of everyone who comes to the JCC.

### A PLACE FOR EVERYONE

This is an amazing group of adults with Down syndrome and autism who live under guardianship. Our programs, like weekly Israeli folk dancing at JCC Budapest, offer them fun opportunities to feel at home within the Jewish community.



Thanks to support from our partners, the group also spends a remarkable week each June at Szarvas Camp, staffed by our regular camp madrichim. This year's entourage included seventeen adults with intellectual disabilities and nine aides who had the chance to swim, dance, sing, visit local attractions, and simply enjoy being together outdoors.

The camp provided a much-needed period of rest and relaxation for participants and their families, who cannot afford to take vacations on their own given the socio-economic impact of their care.

The All-Hearts Club enjoyed an unforgettable experience at Szarvas Camp.

### A HELPING HAND TO UKRAINIAN REFUGEES

Despite depleted resources, we brought together the Hungarian Jewish community and eight partner organizations to organize three open house weekends at the JCC. The events gave over 700 Ukrainian refugees living in Budapest access to essential services, clothing, school supplies, and household items. There was extremely high demand, with registration filling up in under an hour.

### ONE HEART:

### **SUPPORTING ISRAELIS IN HUNGARY**

This has been a life-changing year for Jews everywhere. In the wake of October 7, JCC Budapest stepped up to help in every way possible.

For decades, Budapest has been an exceedingly popular tourist destination for Israelis. Hundreds found themselves stuck in the city after the horrific attacks, unsure when or how they'd be able to get home. We also anticipated the sudden wave of Hungarian olim returning from Israel to Hungary for extended periods of time with their spouses and families.

The situation evolved rapidly. JCC
Budapest-Bálint Ház created a coalition
with our local Jewish community partners
that pooled resources and expertise
to support Israelis facing numerous,
unexpected challenges.

From the outset, we extended the JCC's opening hours to provide the following:

- Special activities for children aged 3-7. We connected parents of older children with our Jewish schools.
- A co-working space with essential equipment like laptops, free WiFi, and restorative coffee and snacks.
- Access to psychological and medical care in partnership with the local Jewish hospital.
- A warm welcome to join community and Jewish holiday events.
- · Winter clothing as the seasons changed.

This support continued for four months, when most of the Israelis returned home.

### **SOLIDARITY VIGIL**

Days after the attacks, JCC Budapest co-organized a vigil at the Dohány Street Synagogue to remember the terror victims and demonstrate our solidarity with Israel.

### FINDING SAFE SPACE AT THE JCC

Natalie, a young Israeli mother, arrived in Budapest on October 17th with her oneyear-old daughter, while her husband remained in Israel on army reserve duty. They had family in Budapest, and the couple agreed this was best for their child. Still, Natalie felt uprooted, afraid, and lonely without her support network in Israel.

Through a Hungarian Jewish women's group on Facebook, she learned that the JCC was providing much-needed resources to Israelis stranded in the city. Hebrewspeaking volunteers entertained her

daughter in the JCC playroom while she utilized our co-working space. She found friends within the Israeli expat community and her daughter had other toddlers to play with. It became their home away from home.

"The JCC was the safest place for us to be," she says.

### ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Our 30th year was marked by growth and change in all areas of our operations and programming.

### PARTNERSHIP WITH JDC

It was the visionary thinking of JDC and its faith in our Jewish future that made it possible for us to launch the JCC Budapest- resources, both financial and professional, Bálint Ház thirty years ago. Today, JDC remains our strategic American partner and important friend, guiding us in our

new iteration as an independent institution since 2022. JDC provides a wide range of that include ongoing strategic consulting, mentorship, resource development guidance, funding, and more.

We are grateful to have recently established Friends of JCC Budapest, a US-based independent 501(c)(3). Its mission is to support the charitable, educational, and religious activities




